TRAINING SHIP TOPGUN BRINGS HOME THE GOLD IN ANNUAL OLYMPICS !!



The annual United States Navy League Cadet Corps (USNLCC) Olympics were held March 31-April 2, 2006, at Naval Weapons Assessment Station, Norco, California. Approximately 15 units in Region 11, including some cadets from as far away as Nevada participated in this event.

Not only does the annual event provide the opportunity for the cadets to demonstrate their athletic and physical abilities as well as build confidence, but it also affords them the chance to get to know members of other units. Teamwork is also reinforced by assigning teams from the various units, not simply one unit against another. As well, the squad leaders and leading petty officers (LPOs) have the opportunity to work on their leadership skills.

The Pacific Southwest Region Eleven Flagship 2006 competition was held at Joint Forces Training Base (JFTB), Los Alamitos from 28-30 April, 2006. This year's competition included Personnel Inspection, Regulation Drill, Color Guard, Exhibition Drill with and without Rifles, Knockout Drill, Semaphore, Knot Typing, Firefighting, Heaving Line and Stretcher/First Aid. Honors were also rendered to GUNFIGHTER Squadron for the 2005 Inspection Year. We were unable to compete at the National level due to the fact that we only had 22 Cadets and the requirement is 25....but there is always next year!

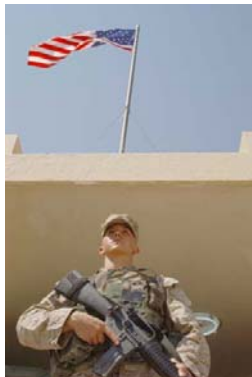
