Petty Officer Herb has completed Navy League Orientation Training at MCRD, San Diego and was awarded the Merit Ribbon for being chosen as Honor Cadet for Company 2 and obtaining a perfect 4.00 Evaluation. He was also awarded the NLCC Merit Ribbon for exceptional performance of duty and as selected as Navy League Cadet of the First Quarter of 2004.

Cadet Herb was appointed as the Squadron's Lead Petty Officer of Training Ship TOPGUN in January 2004. He advanced to Apprentice Cadet in April 2004; Able Cadet in September 2004; and Petty Officer 3rd Class in January 2005. On January 2, 2005 he graduated from Navy League Advanced Training as Battalion Honor Cadet. Cadet Herb has just completed Advanced Training I at NAVSTA San Diego where he obtained an Evaluation score of 3.80. Cadet Herb has just advanced to Petty Officer 2nd Class on July 8, 2005. Sea Cadets are authorized by the Secretary of the Navy to wear Navy uniforms appropriately marked with the Sea Cadet Corps insignia. The NSCC that our council supports is the Gun Fighter Squadron.

The Navy League Cadet Corps (NLCC) is for boys and girls, at least 11 but not yet 14 years old, who are interested in the sea and ships, and our nations seagoing services. The Navy League program is designed to introduce young people to maritime and military life, and to prepare them for later entrance into the Naval Sea Cadet Corps. 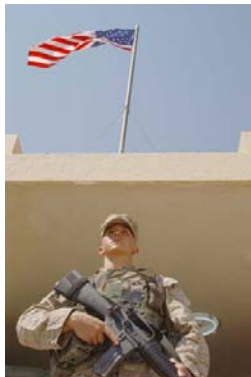
